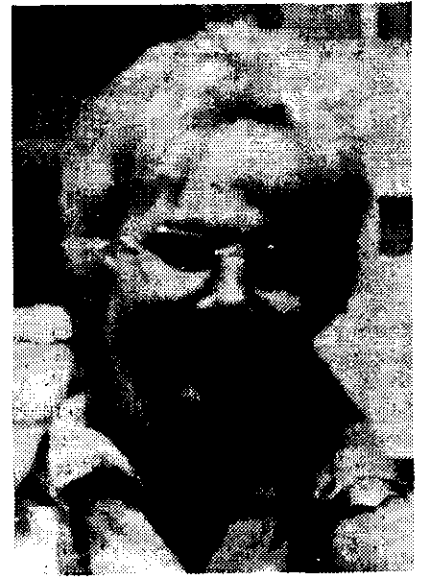


Norma J. Kendall
