During World War II he served in the United States Army in the European theater. Following the war he lived in Grinnell and operated a tavern and pool hall on Fourth Avenue. During the 1950s he helped construct Highways 6 and 146. In the early 1960s he raised Angus cattle on a farm near Delta. After selling the farm in 1964, he moved to Des Moines where he worked as a construction inspector for Anderson Engineering Company. In 1975 in Des Moines he was married to Betty Mohrman. The couple moved to Grinnell in 1986.

He was a member of DAV and a former member of the American Legion and the Grinnell Elks Lodge.

He is survived by his wife Betty Smith of Grinnell; one son Carroll Smith of Conway, Ark.; one daughter Marilyn Rabe, Buffalo, Minn.; one stepson, Robert Mohrman and one stepdaughter, Nancy Mohrman, both of Boone; five grandchildren; two step grandchildren; eight great grandchildren and two step great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents and two sisters, Fern Phillips and Bertha Bagdon.
