He was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in the US Air Force and was assigned to the Lewis Flight Propulsion Laboratory in Cleveland where he was granted a patent for an arm used on the Viking Mars Landers and one for a Snap-8 Boiler. He refereed high school wrestling for ten years, and football for 39 years. He built houses and housing developments, but remained a farmer at heart.

He married Mildred Sprague in June of 1954. They lived in Ohio, and were parents of five children. Laurence married Jean Marie Minor in 1977.
