MONA CHIE IS DEAD

Senior Student in College From Liberia Passed Away Wednesday Night

FUNERAL SERVICES FROM
M. E. CHURCH THIS AFTERNOON

Professor Spencer, Clarence Richards
and Dr. W. C. Wasser Were
Speakers

Mona Chie, a senior of Grinnell College, and a native of Liberia, Africa, of a noble family, died at the Community Hospital Wednesday evening after a lingering illness of several months. He was a universal favorite among his college mates, to whom he had become endeared by his many fine qualities and by his high ambitions. He had been several years in this country and his long struggle for an education was reaching fruition when his fatal sickness fastened itself upon him. All that medical skill could do to save his life was done in vain.

Funeral services were held at 3:30 this afternoon from the Methodist church. Speakers were Professor E. B. T. Spencer, Clarence Richards and Dr. W. C. Wasser. The college male quartet furnished music. Pall bearers were members of his Sunday school class: Everett Woods, Richard Martz, Ernest Jantzen, Ray George, Earl Manor and Raymond See.

Interment was in Hazelwood cemetery.
