

Harold was born on July 26, 1919, on the family farm in the Westfield community south of Grinnell to Harry Adelbert and Leita Parmley Brown. He attended rural school and later graduated with the Class. of 1937 from Grinnell High School. Following his education, he began a career as a farmer and assisted his father raising crops and livestock. In 1943, he entered the Army Air Corp and served in Guam during the Second World War. He returned to Grinnell and was married to Anna May Abel on March 27, 1945, at her mother's home in Grinnell.

Harold was a life-long farmer and operated the family farm in the Westfield area. The farm was recognized as an Iowa Heritage Farm of over 150 years. He also served as record-keeper of the Westfield Cemetery. Following the death of his wife, he remained on the farm until his health failed and he moved to Windsor Manor in Grinnell in 2011. Harold was an active member of the First Baptist Church and also

belonged to the Farm Bureau and the American Legion.

He is survived by his three children, Kathleen (Leland) O'Halloran of Fort Dodge, Richard C.
