Grinnell and for several years in the 1980's he owned and operated the Montezuma Tap.

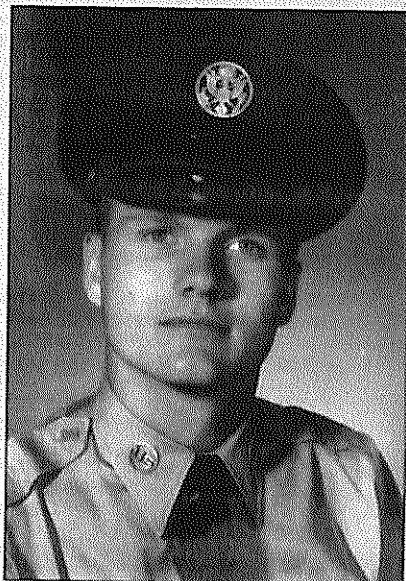
