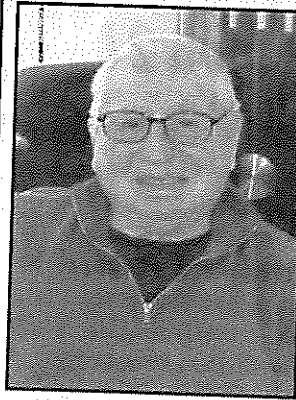


## GLEN "CHUB" THATCHER
