Randy Juhl, 59, of Grinnell died Saturday, Feb. 26, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center

Funeral services for Randy Juhl will be held on Wednesday, March 2, at the Grinnell Christian Church, with the Rev. He was born on April 7, 1945, in Waterloo, the son of Elvin "Curly" and Minnie Snittjer Juhl. He was raised in Reinbeck and was a 1963 grad of Reinbeck High School and a 1968 grad of Iowa State University.

He married Sandra Larsen on June 17, 1967, in Reinbeck, and the couple moved to the Des Moines area, where he was employed for several years with Ernst & Ernst while the couple made their homes in Johnston, Beaverdale and Urbandale.

They moved to Grinnell in 1972 and he was employed as a C.P.A. with Miracle Recreation and, in 1987, with Miraco. He owned and operated Daso Electrostatic Refinishing Inc. from 1991 to 2004 and did some accounting work with ASI Sign Systems in the early 1990s.

He served on the Ahrens Foundation Board and the ASI Board of Advisers and was a member of the Grinnell Eagles Lodge, the Grinnell Booster Club and the Iowa Society of Certified Public Accountants.

He is survived by his wife; three children, Jason Juhl of Edmonds, Okla., Jackie Harris of Grinnell and Jamie Juhl of Waterloo; his father; and two grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his mother.
