Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Ewoldt, wife of Herman Ewoldt of 1706 Fourth avenue, passed away at 9 p.m. Wednesday in a local hospital after a lingering illness. She had passed her 79th birthday on Feb. 19.

Funeral services in charge of Rev. Donald Loots were held at the Smith funeral home Saturday at 2 p.m., with burial in Hazelwood cemetery.

Mary Elizabeth Ewoldt, daughter of Frank Kelm and his wife Julianee Poleska, was born on a farm in Sheridan Township on February 19, 1873. She was baptized in early infancy and was confirmed in the Lutheran faith on Palm Sunday April 3, 1887.

She was united in marriage to Herman Ewoldt on March 12, 1895 in a ceremony held at Trinity Lutheran Church, Malcom. The one child born to this union, Henry Herman Ewoldt, died in infancy.

Mrs. Ewoldt and her husband spent over fifty busy, happy years on their farm in Washington township seven miles southeast of Grinnell. Only a few years ago they moved to Grinnell to their residence on Fourth Avenue.

The deceased passed away quietly at 9:00 in the evening of

May 28, 1952. A lingering illness, which brought much discomfort during her last years, failed to dim her vision of the blessings of her God. She was an active member of St. John Lutheran in Grinnell for many years. She had reached the advanced age of 79 years, 3 months, and 9 days.

Survivors include a brother, Gustav Kelm, two sisters, Mrs. Fred Bangham and Mrs. Emma Rix all of Grinnell and a host of friends. One brother Otto preceded her in death in 1948.
