Glen Joseph Kriegel was

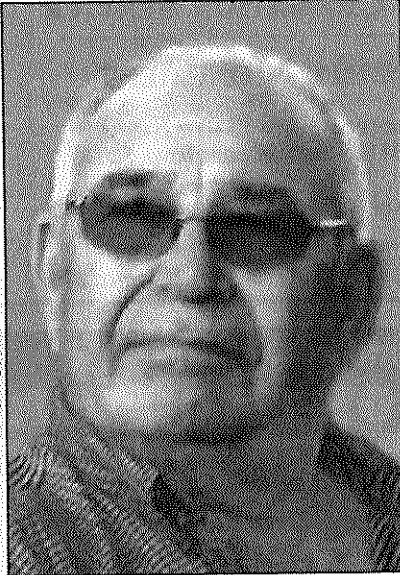
