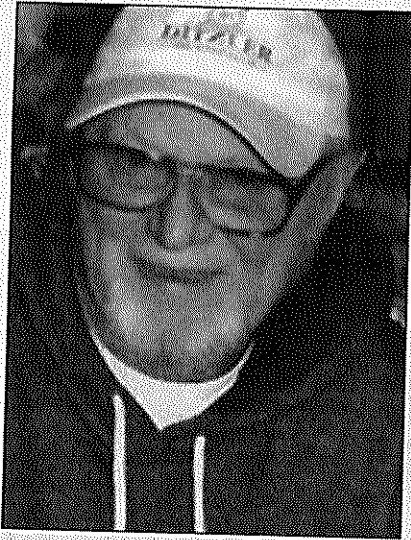


John E. Ditzler
