LITTLE EDWARD WALTERS
DIED OF TYPHOID FEVER
AT CITY HOSPITAL TODAY.

Little Edward Walters, aged seven years, son of Mrs. Granville Walters of this city, died of typhoid fever at city hospital this morning. His mother has been very sick and is now scarcely able to leave her bed. She had not seen her little boy since he was taken from the home last week. It is a comfort to her to know, however, that he received the very best of care and medical attention.

Edward's father died a little more than a year ago. Besides his mother, he leaves a sister, Ruby, his two little brothers, Grover and Henry and a baby sister, Dorothy, one year old. Dorothy never knew her father, he having died before her birth.

Several of the children have been sick and Mrs. Walters has had a hard struggle. She and the brothers and sisters have the sympathy of all their friends and neighbors. There will be a short service at the home in the morning and the little form will be laid to rest in Chester cemetery.

Those who knew Edward personally speak of him as a bright, lovable, manly little chap.
