Marvin E. Campbell, 89, of rural Deep River, died Tuesday, Feb. 14, 2006 at the Montezuma Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Montezuma.

His funeral service was Saturday, Feb. 18, at the Presbyterian Church, Gibson, with the Rev. Mike Conn officiating. Interment was at Sixteen Cemetery, Thornburg. Watts Funeral Home of Montezuma was in charge of the arrangements.
