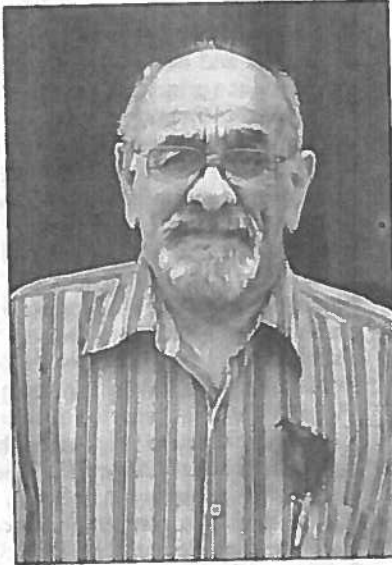


Richard N. Bortell <sup>64-R</sup>
