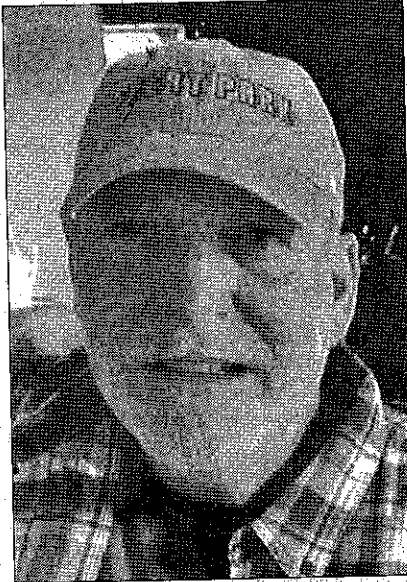

He loved listening to music and attending live concerts. He was most comfortable in his shorts and sandals and loved spending time at Ebert Park.

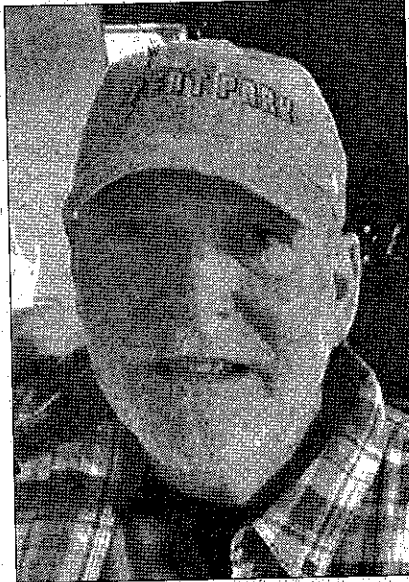
