Mrs. Mary E. Milner Stoops, wife of John Daghiell Stoops, long and fruitful service as professor of Philosophy in Grinnell college, passed away at 12:30 o'clock Tuesday morning in a local hospital, after a long period of declining health. She had passed her 89th birthday on Jan. 2. She was born at Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Canada, in 1856.

Mrs. Stoops had made her home in Grinnell for 41 years and during her days of health took an active part in the community. She possessed a notable artistic talent and enjoyed painting pictures as gifts to her friends which remain as memorials to her kind thoughtfulness in many Grinnell homes.
