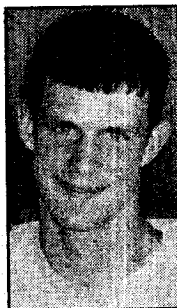


David J. Icenbice, 22

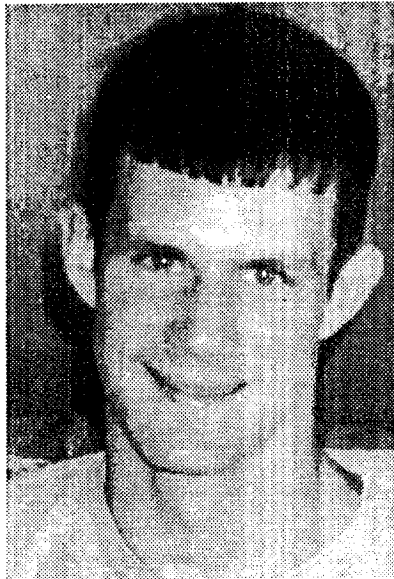
