

Lloyd "Red" Wells, 88

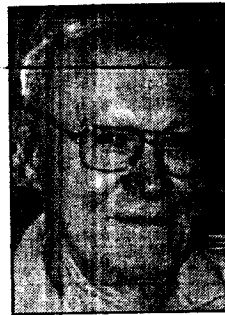
Lloyd "Red" Wells, 88, of Hot Springs Village, Ark., died Nov. 24, 2007, at his residence.

A memorial service, under the direction of Caruth Village Funeral Home, was held at 1 p.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 28, at Village United Methodist Church. Memorials may be made to National Lions World Service.

He was born Nov. 26, 1918, in Grinnell, to the late Lloyd Lewis Wells Sr. and Jesse McCosh Wells.
