

Useful Life Of ¹¹⁻³²

William A. Adams, son of Walter and Martha Adams, was born at Atkinson, Ill., Aug. 3, 1867. Following an illness of about three weeks' duration he passed away at the Community hospital in Grinnell, Nov. 15, 1932, aged 65 years, 3 months and 12 days.

When a child six years old his parents moved to a farm in Jasper county, near Newburg, where Mr. Adams had lived ever since. On Feb. 25, 1893, he was united in marriage to Minnie D. Voss. To this union were born two sons, Harry, living at home, and Henry, who died in infancy.

He leaves besides his wife and son, one brother, Ervin of Newburg, one half-sister, Mrs. Delina White of Kellogg, and a host of relatives and friends. Two sisters, one half-sister and one half-brother preceded him in death.

Will was a good father, a devoted husband, a kind and considerate neighbor. In his passing Newburg and vicinity loses one of its most loyal and respected citizens.

Funeral services were held Friday afternoon at the old Mount Pleasant church southwest of Newburg, at one o'clock, conducted by Rev. H. L. Wissler of Chester Center. A mixed quartet from Newburg sang two numbers. "Jesus Savior Pilot Me," and "Nearer My God to Thee."

Pallbearers were Ole Lee, Thomas Eames, Louis Koger, William Paul, Chester Hummel, and Glen McCarel. Interment was in the family lot at Mount Pleasant cemetery.
