Mrs. Alexander Dies Saturday, Rites Tomorrow

Funeral services are scheduled tomorrow for Mrs. Carrie Alexander, who died at a local hospital Saturday after being injured in a fall at her home.

Mrs. Alexander was born on Feb. 19, 1883, near Davenport. She was the daughter of Cassius and Hannah Smith Morgan. The family moved to Grinnell, and she attended local schools.

She was married to J. Emory Alexander on Feb. 11, 1902, with the Rev. E. M. Vittum presiding at the ceremony here.
