MAE C. ANDERS, GRINNELL, DIES

GRINNELL, IA. — Mae C. Anders, chief organizer and first president of the Ray-



mond Blank Hospital guild in Des Moines, died Friday of a heart attack. She was in her seventies.

Miss Anders was an assistant librarian in the Des Moines public library until her retirement in 1950.

MISS ANDERS Daughter of an Iowa Falls librarian, she had come to Des Moines in 1921 to work for the library.

Two years after its beginning the Blank hospital guild had 1,600 members, who engaged in a wide variety of hospital programs from personal services to donating funds.

For her original work Miss Anders had been honorary president for life.

Services will be 10 a. m. Monday at Congregational Church here. She had made her home here since retirement.

One sister, Ida, of Knoxville, Tenn., survives.

Funeral Services This Morning For Miss Mae Anders

Miss Mae C. Anders, a resident of Montgomery Hall at Mayflower Home, died Friday morning at her home. She was 74.

Funeral services for Miss Anders were held this morning (Monday) from the First Congregational church with the Rev. Ralph Beebe officiating. Interment was in Hazelwood cemetery with the James-Schallinske Funeral Home in charge.

The daughter of Horace S. and Florence Guthrie Anders, she was born on June 29th, 1884, at Williams, Ia.

Miss Anders was the assistant librarian for the Des Moines Public Libraries for a number of years and was also the originator of the Blank Hospital Guild. She was a member of the First Congregational church of Grinnell.

She is survived by one sister, Miss Ida A. Anders of Knoxville, Tenn.
