**Areatha Anderson,
Succumbs Friday;
Services Today**

Mrs. Areatha A. Anderson, 73, of 703 Main Street, wife of Clark Anderson, died suddenly Friday morning at her home.

Funeral services were held this afternoon (Monday) from the Smith Funeral Home with the Rev. John Pannkuk, pastor of Trinity Lutheran church, officiating. Organ music was provided by Mrs. Rhee Auman.

Pallbearers were Albert Deppe, Dale Deppe, Ernest Deppe, Gerald Deppe, David Springer and George Wilson. Burial was in Hazelwood cemetery.

Born north of Kellogg on Dec. 15th, 1892, she was the daughter of Dulin and Della Wiess Shill. She was married on Feb. 18th, 1916, to Clark Anderson at Newton.
