—Charles Bailey, a former well known resident here, was instantly killed in Chicago by a switch engine while crossing the street on his way to the place of his employment Thursday morning, June 22, 1905. No one saw him struck. He was born June 23, 1839 and lived here until 1899 when he left Grinnell in the fall and has resided in Chicago a greater part of the time since. The deceased was married in Chicago, April 16, 1896, to Miss Jennie McAvoy of that place. He is survived by his wife, two sisters, Mrs. J. P. Skinner and Mrs. J. E. Bayer, two brothers, F. L. and T. A. Bailey of Grinnell and one sister, Mrs. W. P. Arthur of Montezuma, Iowa, all of whom were present at the funeral services in Chicago. The deceased left many friends among whom he always bore a reputation for honesty, good habits and a kind nature.
