Mrs. Mabel Elizabeth Barns, 83, the widow of Frank H. Barns, died Wednesday evening at the Haven Guest Home in Red Wing, Minn., where she had made her home the past five years.

The daughter of Anson and Lydia Dart Moxley, she was born June 26, 1881, in Newburg. She received her education here, graduating from the Grinnell Academy, and she later taught in the rural schools

near Newburg. On March 17, 1909, she was married to Frank H. Barns at Newburg. The couple had two daughters. Mrs. Lloyd (Lucille) Johnson of Red Wing and Mrs. Richard (Rachel) Sanders of Grinnell. Mr. and Mrs. Barns had farmed near Montezuma and Grinnell for a few years before moving to Grinnell to make their home. Mr. Barns was a long-time employee of the Grinnell Post Office, preceding his wife in death in 1945.

Mrs. Barns was a member of the First Baptist Church and had taught Sunday school for a number of years. She was also a member of the ladies auxiliary of the Post Office employees.
