

Mr. Barquist rites today

Arthur E. Barquist, 92, of 90 Fourth Ave., Grinnell, formerly of Minneapolis, Minn., died Saturday morning, July 9, at Friendship Manor.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. today at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Otis Borop, pastor of the Grace United Methodist Church of Minneapolis, officiating. Organist will be Barbara Lien, and vocalist will be Laura Thompson. Pallbearers will be Richard Brown, Dan Carroll, Tom Hotchkin, Joseph W. Lincoln, Dale E. Peak, J. Mr. Barquist was a member of the Grace United Methodist Church, the Plymouth Masonic Lodge, and the Old Guard Club in Minneapolis. The couple moved to Grinnell in 1982 and became members of the First United Presbyterian Church.

He is survived by his wife, Irene. He was preceded in death by his parents; two brothers, Verner and Gerald Barquist; and a sister, Lillian Barquist.
