

Lincoln C. Bartusek

Funeral services for Lincoln C. Bartusek, 79, of Tama were held Monday, May 22, at Harrison Funeral Home in Tama, with the Rev. Joel Rose officiating. Mr. Bartusek died Thursday, May 18, 2000, at Friendship Manor Care Centre in Grinnell due to a short illness. Military rites were provided by Engrich-Schrader American Legion Post #0073 of Tama, and interment was at Pleasant Hill Cemetery in Blairstown.
