A memorial service for Daniel P. Baustian, who drowned near San Francisco, Calif., July 18, when a U.S. Navy helicopter crashed at sea, will be held at 2:30 p.m. Sunday at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Brooklyn.

The Rev. Karl Holtkamp, pastor of St. Patrick's Catholic Church, and the Rev. Maynard Brothersen of Albia will officiate.

Daniel Baustian is survived by his wife, Helene of North Platte, Neb.; a daughter, Stephanie; his mother, Rita Baustian of Brooklyn; his father, Gerald Baustian of North Platte; a brother, Gerald of the Naval Air Station, San Diego, Calif.; and six sisters, Teresa Baustian of Des Moines, Kathleen Baustian of Des Moines, Diane Burke of Okinawa, Japan, Leslie Doerle of St. Louis, Mo., Loretta Baustian of Minneapolis, Minn., and Jennifer Baustian of Brooklyn.

A memorial service was held Aug. 7 for Daniel Paul Baustian, 25, of North Platte, Neb., who died July 18 as the result of a Navy helicopter crash in the Pacific Ocean outside San Francisco Bay. He was a member of the mine-sweeping squadron HM-15.

Services were officiated by his uncle, the Rev. Maynard Brothersen of Albia, and the Rev. Karl Holtkamp. Organist was Marilyn Kriegel.

Burial arrangements are being made at Carpenter Funeral Home in North Platte, with burial at Fort McPherson National Cemetery.

He was born Jan. 9, 1963, in Grinnell, the son of Gerald and Rita Brothersen Baustian. He attended Grinnell schools and graduated from BGM High School in 1981. He then attended Mid Plains Community College where he received his diploma in auto mechanics and auto body repair.

He enlisted in the U.S. Navy in June 1986 and received his training at Great Lakes Naval Training Center, Memphis, Pensacola, Moffett Field, Norfolk and Alameda Naval Air Stations.
