## NOBLE CHESTER LADY PASSES AWAY

Words of Praise and Appreciation From Pastor, Rev. H. L. Wissler.

In the passing of Mrs. I. A. Bean, Chester Township has lost one of its most beloved women.

Mrs. Bean was born Kathryn Dimit near Keota, Ia., Mar. 29th, 1849. She died at her home in Chester, Sept. 17, 1926, aged 77 yrs., 5 mos. and 8 days.

She leaves to mourn her loss her husband and four children and many friends, who remember her as a sympathetic, loving neighbor and friend.

The funeral services were held from the George Hafkey home conducted by her pastor, Rev. H. L. Wissler last Sunday afternoon and interment was made in the Chester Cemetery.
