When he was 20 years of age the family removed to Wolworth County, Wisconsin, where they remained for about a year, then came to Johnson County, Iowa. This was in the fall of 1856. Then later he removed to Poweshiek County and settled on the farm which he owned and occupied at the time of his death. He was married in 1866 to Miss Elizabeth Nicholas, who survives him. To this union were born seven children, all of whom are living and were present at the funeral, except the youngest daughter Maud, who resides in Washington, D. C. They are: Alfretra, Alonzo A., Jesse J., Mary C., Nettie A., Francilla and Maud. Mr. Boget was a kind and loving husband and father, and a highly respected citizen in the community in which he lived. He is also survived by nine teen grandchildren, five great grandchildren, two brothers, Charles of National City, Cal., David of Seattle, Wash., and a sister, Nancy A. Carpenter of Hartington, Neb.

Mr. Boget had not enjoyed very good health for some time, although he was not confined to his bed, but during the past few days he grew steadily worse. His end came Friday, April 8th. He passed away on his 74th birthday. He was converted and confessed Christ as his Saviour many years ago. He had many friends and will be greatly missed by a large circle of friends and neighbors.

BOGET, A. E.—Farmer and stock-raiser, sections 13 and 14, P. O. Searsboro. Born in Washington county, New York, about the year 1836, where he lived on the farm with his parents until the year 1857, when his parents removed to McHenry county, Illinois, Albert E., who was then a lad of some fifteen years, accompanying them, where he continued to live with and labor for his parents until he was about twenty years of age, when they again removed to Walworth county, Wisconsin, he still remaining with them. For about a year they all remained in Wisconsin, and then removed to Iowa, and settled in Johnson county, in the northwest part. This was in the fall of 1856, and he remained in Johnson county until the fall of 1869, when he removed to this county and settled on the same farm which he now owns and occupies, consisting of 160 acres of fine land, most of which, in order to reclaim, had to be grubbed. Mr. Boget has about 100 acres improved, 90 of which he has grubbed with his own hands. He has as nice a farm as there is in this section of country, which is all fenced with good substantial fence, and the improved part in a good state of cultivation.
