She is also survived by two grandsons, Clen and Charles Lincoln; one brother, James A. Livezey of Montezuma; one sister, Mrs. P. J. Barnhart of Portland, Ore.; several nieces and nephews, and a host of other relatives and friends.

She dearly loved her only two grandsons, Clen and Charles, and just Saturday evening had telephoned and asked to bring them to the University Hospital on Sunday, so she could see them and visit with them. This plan was carried out and the family of six had a wonderful hour and a half of visiting and laughter.

She was a devoted mother, and was always interested in the community activities which made her a good neighbor, always ready to help in case of need.

After recently having major brain surgery, and gaining back fair health, she contacted a respiratory condition which resulted in an unexpected death early Monday evening.

She was preceded in death by two brothers, Wm. P. and George Livezey, and two sisters, Gertie Dexter and Aly Allen.

Funeral services were held in the Grinnell Methodist church on Thursday at 1:30 in charge of Rev. G. S. Bruland, with music by Alfred Steen, vocalist, with Mamie Watson accompanying. He sang "Beautiful Isle of Somewhere" and "God Be With You Till We Meet Again."

The pallbearers were Homer McDowell, Alfred McDowell, Raymond Baker, Bert Hasley, Floyd Hasley, and Kenneth Smith. Interment was in Hazelwood cemetery.
