She was then married to Gerald L. Bolen and the couple made their home in Grinnell. For the past ten years, Mrs. Bolen worked part-time at the Four Winds Motel. She was a member of the United Church of Christ-Congregational of Grinnell.

Survivors include her son, Dan Agnew of Grinnell; two grandchildren; and one sister, Lois White of Grinnell. She was preceded in death by both of her husbands; and her daughter, June Agnew.
