

Former Resident Is Dead In Auto Crash

Mrs. Philip Boucher, 44, of Roswell, N.M., the former Jane Korns and daughter of I.T. Korns of Brooklyn, and her mother-in-law, Mrs. Ruth Boucher of Mesa, Ariz., were killed Sunday in an automobile accident near Carlsbad, N.M. Accident details were not available.

Funeral services are pending at Mesa, Ariz., awaiting the arrival of Philip Boucher, the dead woman's husband, from Christmas Island in the Pacific.

It was learned here that the two women had planned a weekend trip to Carlsbad and apparently were enroute to Roswell when the accident occurred. The elderly Mrs. Boucher was visiting her daughter-in-law while her son was on duty in the Pacific.

Mr. and Mrs. T.T. Korns were unable to make the trip to Arizona due to the ill health of Mr. Korns. Mrs. Coe Manatt, an aunt of Mrs. Philip Boucher, left Tuesday via plane for Mesa. She was accompanied by Mrs. J.M. Barclay.

Helen Jane Korns, daughter of Truman T. and Bessie Jones Korns, was born near Hartwick, Iowa, on Nov. 10, 1917, coming to Brooklyn in 1920.

She attended the Brooklyn school, graduating in 1936. Because of ill health she went to Phoenix, Ariz. in 1938 to make her home.

During World War II she served two years with the Waves.

She was a member of the Methodist church and the P.E.O. Sisterhood.

On January 10, 1948, she was united in marriage to Philip T. Boucher of Sioux City, stationed at Williams Air Base in Arizona.

On June 10, 1962, Helen Jane Boucher and her mother-in-law, Mrs. Ruth Boucher, were killed in a car accident near Carlsbad, New Mexico.

A double funeral service was held June 15 in Queen of Peace church in Mesa, Arizona, with burial in Mountain View Memorial cemetery.

She was preceded in death by her mother in 1936. Survivors are her husband, C.W.O. Philip T. Boucher of Roswell, New Mexico, and her father and step-mother, Mr. and Mrs. Truman T. Korns of Brooklyn, Iowa.
