## Rites Wednesday For Mr. Bowersox

Frederic C. Bowersox, 80, of Buckley Hall at the Mayflower Home in Grinnell, died Sunday afternoon, May 31.

The son of Jacob Shuey and Jane Elizabeth Hutson, Bowersox, Mr. Bowersox was born at Shueyville, Iowa, on Sept. 30, 1889. He received his college education at Coe College and later did graduate work at the University of Iowa. During World War I he served in the U.S. Army.

Mr. Bowersox was married to Margaret Hartness on June 15,

1918 at Cedar Rapids, Iowa. To this union were born five children — Mrs. Roger (Barbara) Frchardt of Royal Oak, Mich. Mrs. Marjory Barry of Great Falls, Mont., and David F. Bowersox of Los Alamos, N. Mex.

Mr. Bowersox had been county superintendent of the Clinton County school system and had been associated with the Clinton schools for 40 years. Prior to his work in Clinton, Mr. and Mrs. Bowersox had made their home in Garnavillo for three years, Brandon for three years and Elwood for three years. They have made their home in Grinnell the past six years.

Mr. Bowersox was a member of the American Legion, the Veteran's of World War I, the Masonic Lodge and the Scottish Rite Consistory. He had received his 50 year jewel in the Consistory a few years ago.

Survivors include his wife Margaret, his three children, and nine grandchildren.

Mr. Bowersox was preceded in death by two children in infancy and seven brothers and sisters.

Funeral services for Mr. Bowersox will be held 2 p.m. Wednesday at the Grinnell United Methodist church with the Rev. J. Eugene Young, minister of the church, officiating.
