

Wm. Boyle Stricken Fri. While Attending Sale In Knoxville

William Clark Boyle well-known farmer residing seven miles south of town, died suddenly Friday afternoon of a coronary thrombosis in Knoxville where he was attending a sale. He was rushed to a hospital when stricken and died shortly after arrival. He was 69 years old.

Funeral services were held at the James funeral home this afternoon in charge of Rev. C. O. Whitely assisted by Rev. Russell Sams with burial in Hazlewood cemetery.
