

Tom Bradley, Businessman, Farmer Dies

Native of Ireland,
Operated Service
Station 25 Years

Thomas John Bradley, native of Ireland and a resident of Grinnell most of his lifetime, died Thursday, Feb. 17. He was 73 years old.

Funeral services were conducted from James Funeral Home Saturday afternoon with Rev. John DeLong, pastor of the Methodist church, officiating.

Born In Ireland

Born in Londonderry county, Ireland, July 12, 1881, Mr. Bradley was the son of Archibald and Martha Hayes Bradley. He came to the United State at the age of 15 and with his family settled on a farm near Grinnell. He was married Dec. 24, 1906, to Nellie A. Schultz.

The Bradleys farmed near Grinnell until 1929 when he and his family moved to their home on the east city limits where he

ated for 25 years.

Surviving are his wife, Nellie; two sons, Harold A. and Thomas G., of Grinnell; two daughters, Mrs. Mike (Gladys) Enich of Des Moines, and Mrs. George (Edith) Bowman; five grandchildren, two brothers and two sisters in Los Angeles, Calif., and several nieces and nephews.

Preceding him in death were his parents, one brother and two sisters.
