Leo W. Braley, Kellogg Farmer, Dies Recently

KELLOGG (Special) — Leo W. Braley, 66, a lifelong resident of the Kellogg community, died on May 12 at the Veterans Hospital in Des Moines.

Services were held Friday afternoon, May 14, at the Johnson chapel in Newton, with the Rev. Herbert Miller of the Kellogg Christian church officiating. Organ music was provided by Mrs. Jerry Waters.

Pallbearers were Earl Faircloth, Hoyt Veber, Robert Mulford, Gail Ebert, Jack Wehrle, and Roger Stewart. Interment was in Our Silent City cemetery at Kellogg.

The son of Otis and Fannie Blakely Braley, he was born Feb. 12, 1899, at Kellogg and attended the Kellogg and Newton schools.

Mr. Braley was a veteran of World War I and served on the USS Wyoming as a member of a gunnery crew.

He was united in marriage with Ethel Holmdahl on Sept. 22, 1920, at Kellogg. They were engaged in farming near here.

Survivors include his widow, Ethel; a son, Wallace of Kellogg; a daughter, Mrs. Gary (Susan) Verwers of Omaha, Neb.; and five grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, a brother, and a grandchild.
