DIES AT CITY OF

REV. D. P. BREED DIES IN CHICAGO

Former Honored Resident of Grinnell Died Suddenly Tuesday Night

FUNERAL SERVICE NEXT
SUNDAY IN CHICAGO

Burial Will Be in Eaton Rapids Where
One Son, Reuben, Is
Buried.

Rev. D. P. Breed, for many years an honored and respected resident of Grinnell, died very suddenly Tuesday during the night. Word of his death was received here Thursday in a letter from Carrie F. Taylor, a niece of Mrs. Breed, to Nelle Rule.

Funeral services will be held Sunday at 3 o'clock p. m. from the home in Chicago, and burial will be made in Eaton Rapids, where a son, Rev. Reuben Breed, is buried.

Dr. Breed had not been in active pastoral work for some time, having suffered a stroke several months ago, but had been able recently to do a good deal of supply work in various pulpits. Miss Rule visited him and Mrs. Breed in Chicago last summer and reports that at that time they both seemed much as usual.

Dr. and Mrs. Breed were both active and prominent during their years of residence in Grinnell. For a number of years Dr. Breed was field representative for Grinnell college among the Congregational churches of Iowa and Mrs. Breed was prominent in state wide missionary and church activities.

Many friends here will regret to learn of the passing of Dr. Breed and will extend sincerest condolences to Mrs. Breed and the family.
