Mrs. Breeden rites Friday

Florence Glen Breeden, 89, of Newburg died at the home of her son on Tuesday, Jan. 13.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Friday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Kenneth Wallace, pastor of the Newburg Church, officiating. Organist will be Alice Renaud, and vocalists will be members of the Newburg quartet, Delmar and Jean Sharp and Virgil and Ruth Palmer.

On June 21, 1916, she was married to James A. Breeden at Boone. The couple continued to live near Newburg. Mrs. Breeden was a member of the Newburg Congregational United Church of Christ since 1912.

She is survived by her son, L. Edward Breeden of Rte. 2, Grinnell; 11 grandchildren; and 17 great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband in 1957; two daughters, Miriam E. Loudon in 1971 and Florence in infancy; three brothers, Ralph, Milo and Roscoe McCulley; and one half-sister, Gertrude Campbell Dodd.
