WALLACE BRENNIMAN

Funeral services for Wallace Breniman, 77, of Brooklyn, were held at 10:30 a.m., Monday, Feb. 22, in the Nevenhoven Funeral Home, Brooklyn. Mr. Breniman died Friday, Feb. 19, 1988, at Grinnell General Hospital, Grinnell.
