
Rev. Dale D. Brown



The Rev. Dale D. Brown, 82, of the Mayflower died of renal failure Friday, March 27, at the Mayflower Health Care Center.

A memorial service will be conducted Monday, April 6, at the Grinnell United Church of Christ -Congregational, with the Rev. Robert Molsberry officiating.

The body was donated to the University of Iowa College of medicine.

He was the son of David and Ellen Johnson Brown and was born Jan. 20, 1916, in Jennings, Kan. He was raised in Kansas, Arizona and Colorado, and the family later settled in Osborne, Kan., where he graduated from high school. He graduated from Kansas Wesleyan University and was a 1940 graduate of Yale Divinity College. He worked in refugee camps in Cuba and Canada.

On June 19, 1943, he was married to Isabel MacKenzie in Toronto, Canada. They lived in various areas of Europe, returning to the United States in 1949. They moved to Madrid, Iowa, in May 1949, and Mr. Brown served as a minister for the Congregational Church. He also served churches in Atlantic, Ottumwa and Eagle Grove. The couple retired and moved to the Mayflower in March 1988.

He was a member of the Grinnell United Church of Christ - Congregational. He was past president of the Ottumwa Branch of the NAACP and was also past president of the

Club of Ottumwa.

He is survived by his daughter, Sheena A. Thomas of Des Moines; three sons, David T. and Alexander M., both of Denver, Colo., and Robert M. of Tacoma, Wash.; eight grandchildren; and four brothers, Bartos B. of Jennings, Kan., Charles G. of Oskaloosa, Dwight C. of Topeka, Kan., and Allen of Hannibal, Mo. He was preceded in death by his parents and his wife.
