Last Services Are Held Thursday for George D. Brown, Former Employe of Herald

George David Brown, son of Henry C. and Eliza Brown, was born near Mt. Vernon, Iowa, March 2, 1867, and passed away at his home on First avenue, Grinnell, April 16, 1935, at the age of 68 years, one month and 14 days.

He came to Grinnell at the age of 20 years and had spent the largest share of his life in or near Grinnell. He was united in marriage to Delilah M. Adams in 1899.
