

## Harry Brown Services Held <sup>2/21/73</sup>

Harry A. Brown, 86, of 325 East St., Grinnell, died Wednesday, Feb. 21, at his home.

The son of George A. and Amelia Howell Brown, he was born Aug. 15, 1885, in the Westfield community south of Grinnell. He received his education in the rural Westfield schools. He attended the Westfield Community Church and was a member of the Westfield Grange.

On Dec. 22, 1912, he was married to Leila Parmley, who preceded him in death in 1955. He farmed in the Westfield community until 1930 when he moved to Grinnell.
