L.L. Brown, 94, of rural Grinnell died Sunday, Oct. 22, at his home.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. John Epper-son, pastor of the Grinnell Christian Church, officiating. Burial was in Maple Grove Cemetery in rural Tama County.

In 1919 he moved to Grinnell and worked at the Spaulding factory for several years and later as a farm hand.
