

Conduct Funeral Rites Today For Mrs. Lulu Budd

Mrs. Lulu M. Budd, 79, widow of Charles E. Budd, died late Thursday evening at a local hospital after an illness of about one week.

Services were held this afternoon (Monday) from the Smith Funeral Home with Dr. G. S. Bruland of the Methodist church officiating. Vocal music was by Mrs. Dolph Miller, accompanied by Mrs. Rhee Auman at the organ.
