

Rites held for Mr. Bunnell

Jesse E. Bunnell, 84, of Brooklyn died Wednesday, July 28, following a long illness.

Funeral services were conducted at 11 a.m. Saturday at the United Presbyterian Church of Brooklyn, with the Revs. Lynn Williams and Daniel Driscoll officiating. Organist was Nina Bartachek, and vocalists were Marilyn Montgomery, Agnew Montgomery and Ruth Roudabush.
