Mrs. Margaret Ella Burlingame, 96, of Albia, the widow of Carl A. Burlingame, died Nov. 23, 1986 at Friendship Manor in Grinnell.

She was the daughter of Alexander and Agnes Paul Wylie, and was born near Laurel, Jasper County, Iowa, on May 13, 1890. Her family moved to the Brooklyn area to farm in 1901. She graduated from Brooklyn High School in 1909, and taught school for a year.

She was married at her parents' home to Carl A. Burlingame on Dec. 1, 1910. She and her husband farmed near Brooklyn with the exception of two years when they farmed near Grinnell. In 1941 they moved to a farm north of Albia, from which they retired in 1969 going to their home in Albia. She was a member of the Albia United Presbyterian Church.

She is survived by two children: Elwood F. Burlingame of Grinnell and Evelyn A. Bass of Oklahoma City, Okla.; four grandsons; seven great grandchildren and one great-great-granddaughter. She was preceded in death by her husband, Carl on Oct. 29, 1986; a granddaughter; five sisters and three brothers: Edith Wylie, Lavina Beery, Adda Kline, Maude Wylie, an infant sister, and Leslie, Ray and Everett Wylie.
