

OBITUARY.

ARTHUR W. BURROUGHS.

The Pacific Outlook, published in Grants Pass, Oregon, has the following to say of the late Arthur Burroughs: Died in this city, Wednesday, May 11, 1910, Arthur W. Burroughs, aged about 35 years, of tuberculosis.

Mr. Burroughs had been a resident of Grants Pass for about two years and a half, coming to this place from Grinnell, Iowa. He had been an employee of a prominent manufacturing company for some time previous to his arrival here, and it was largely through close application to his duties that he contracted the dread disease that caused his death. It was with the hope of overcoming this that he came to Grants Pass, and during the best year of his stay he showed a decided improvement. During the last few months, however, his disease became complicated with other troubles, and he gradually failed until death claimed him.

He was a most estimable Christian young man, of a sound and confident nature and though on account of his troubles and his quiet disposition he had not become prominent in the community, he made many friends especially in the congregation of Bethany church, of which he and his wife were members. The esteem in which he was held was made manifest by the kindly tokens of friendship and sympathy shown during his last days, and by the wealth of beautiful floral offerings presented at the funeral. The funeral services were held at the home on Friday afternoon, Rev. Robt. McLean, of Bethany, conducting and the interment was at Odd Fellows cemetery. There the dual sad rites were softened and beautified by the masses of flowers which the friends had strewn about the grave—mute emblems of the pure but fleeting life that had just passed.
