**Funeral Services

Elizabeth, daughter of Mary and William Edgerton, was born in Ireland, on May 13, 1880, and died in Orlando, Fla., Feb. 18, at 80 years of age.

She was seven years of age when she came with her mother to America, to join her father who had previously come to this country. Her parents lived southeast of Deep River, where she attended rural school. She became an excellent seamstress and, also, a practical nurse for Doctors Crain and Crain.

On Feb. 22, 1911, she was united in marriage with W. C. (Jud) Butcher, and to this union, two children were born. They made their home on their farm until the death of Mr. Butcher in 1940. For several years, Lizzie has spent the winters in Florida.

She was a long-time member of the Church of Christ, and an active member of the Ladies Aid. She was a member of the Sunshine club.

She is survived by her daughter, Dorothy Axtell, Deep River; her son, Donald, Earlham; five grandchildren, other relatives and many friends.
