

## Eural Carter, 81 Succumbs Friday To Long Illness

Funeral services for Eural Levi Carter, 81, Grinnell, were held this afternoon from the First Baptist church with the Rev. C. E. Kingsley officiating. Mr. Carter died Friday at a local hospital following a lingering illness.

Additional services will be held Wednesday afternoon in his home church in Burlingame, Kansas with Rev. Kingsley again officiating. Burial will be in the Burlingame cemetery.

Son of Walter Owen and Carrie Elizabeth Wilson Carter, he was born October 17th, 1877, at Sandoval, Ill. When Mr. Carter was seven years old the family moved to Kansas, making the trip by covered wagon. He grew to manhood in eastern Kansas, and spent most of his life in the Burlingame community.

He was united in marriage to Lydia Viola Carter July 11th, 1900, at Auburn, Kansas. Mr. and Mrs. Carter spent their life in agriculture and they devoted much time and effort in the work of the church and community. Mr. Carter was a member of the Baptist church for nearly 60 years.

In recent years he lived in semi-retirement. For the past 14 months he had made his home with his daughter in Grinnell.

He was preceded in death by his wife, one grandson, and his friend, Lota Engle, with whom he made his home for many years.

Survivors include two daughters, Mrs. Ray Holmquist of Burlingame, Kan., and Mrs. C. E. Kingsley of Grinnell; two granddaughters, Karla and Ruby Kingsley of Grinnell; one sister, Mrs. Walter Howe of Burlingame, and several neices and nephews.
