George W. Case, son of Mr. and Mrs. Emory Case, was born August 12th, 1866 and passed away December 28th, 1929 at the age of 63 years, 4 months and 16 days.

He was born in LaSalle, Illinois, while his parents were journeying by covered wagon from Ohio to Iowa. They settled first at Ladora, later coming to Grinnell where he spent almost his entire life.

He was united in marriage to Alice Lovella Reeves on April 15th, 1884.

To this union were born three sons, all of whom with his wife survive him.

Of the sons, Harry and Virgil live in Grinnell, while Alvin at the present time is a patient in the Government Hospital in Arizona.

There also survive one brother, William Case of Des Moines, two sisters, Mrs. Samuel Dunlap of Ft. Collins, Colorado, and Mrs. Ida Skeels of Grinnell, and nine grand children.

Mr. Case was favorably known in Grinnell. In his early years he was a moulder by trade, having worked in the old foundry of Craven, Steele and Austin, here in Grinnell. Later he was employed in the Spaulding factory.

In the last years of his life he was a great sufferer, being confined at the Community Hospital for over three years.

Funeral services were held at Snyder's Chapel on Monday afternoon conducted by the Rev. George Blagg assisted by Rev. Clark McFate. The songs, "No Night There" and "The Homeland" were sung by the Rev. C. C. Smith, accompanied by Mrs. Roscoe Dempster. Burial was made in Hazelwood. The pall bearers were: Messrs.
